

Vacancy for a two co-opted independent members of the Surrey Police and Crime Panel (PCP)

The Panel is part of the new governance and accountability arrangements for policing in Surrey. The Panel's role is to maintain a regular check and balance on the performance of the directly elected Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC).

The Panel is looking for two committed and energetic individuals to serve as Co-opted Independent Members to serve a four-year term alongside councillors from local authorities in Surrey. This is an opportunity to be involved in a changing landscape around the Police Service.

Appointments will be for the PCC's term of office, with one appointment filled with immediate effect at the Police & Crime Panel's public meeting on **7th February 2020**. The other position will be appointed at the next meeting of the Panel in **30th June 2020**, after the election of the Police and Crime Commissioner in May 2020.

In considering your application, you should be aware that the typical commitment required from a member of the Panel is expected to average six times a year, including preparation time and there may be additional external visits. Meetings will generally be held during normal office hours (Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm) at County Hall, Kingston-upon-Thames, although it is possible that the Panel will meet at other venues around the County.

Whilst this is not a paid post, you will be reimbursed for any travel costs and expenses incurred during the course of your duties.
