Within our adapted environment and with adjustments in place, students are typically able to access the National Curriculum in line with their chronological age and able to achieve at GCSE level.

We are known and respected for providing high quality teaching, therapy and pastoral support. We promote and recognise that each student is an individual with individual needs, acknowledging that a diagnosis will only provide part of the picture for each student. Our integrated approach to therapy, coupled with the small and close community we have here at Northeast, enables us to understand students as a whole and use that knowledge to ensure the best outcomes for each student.

Our location, a spacious country site built round an 18th century manor house, gives everyone room to grow, and develop in a true community with a family feel and we are an easy commute from Brighton, Tunbridge Wells and Eastbourne.

The school's approach to meeting the needs of students is holistic, and this is an opportunity to join a dynamic team that involves Speech & Language Therapists, teachers, support and pastoral staff, who are dedicated to enabling Northeast Manor to continue as a centre of excellence.

This Occupational Therapist Lead post includes among other responsibilities, oversight of the school's clinical caseload, leadership on service improvement, the delivery of staff training and developing others, the embedding of effective whole school approaches and daily opportunities for direct work with young people.
