Specialist Modern Foreign Languages Teacher - Manor Field Primary School - May 2019

You will be responsible to the Headteacher to promote and support the progress of all children to achieve the highest possible standards in MFLs. This role is to cover the teachers' PPA as well as lead on MFLs at Manor Field.

Main purpose of the role:

- Provide a high quality MFL education so that pupils develop a love of foreign languages
- Create MFL based opportunities and events both in school and the wider community
- Co-ordinate extra-curricular MFL activities

General:

- Support the vision, ethos and policies of the school
- Make a significant contribution to the aims, objectives and implementation of the school improvement plan
- Ensure high standards of professional conduct
- Lead MFL across the school and co-ordinate relevant events throughout the year
- Lead MFL after school clubs
- Lead relevant assemblies relating to the subject

Teaching and Development:

- Teach MFL as set out in the National Curriculum to all year groups including: understanding and using MFL; learning about a variety of languages and cultures, learn to converse in the language
- Lead on curriculum for MFL, monitor and evaluate aspects of teaching, learning and assessment for the subject
- Lead by example as a MFL teacher, modelling exemplary classroom practice
- Participate in continued professional development opportunities

Communication:

- Update the Senior Leadership Team on the effectiveness of MFL provision for pupils
- Liaise and collaborate with teachers and other professionals in relation to MFL
- Develop and maintain effective relationships with the wider school community

Additional Duties:

- Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of all pupils
- Ensuring a high standard of care for pupils is consistently maintained
- Carrying out any other duties to ensure the smooth running of the school which might reasonably be requested by the Headteacher

The range of duties listed above extend the role of a MFL teacher, but do not replace such other duties that may be required, as laid down by the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Acts. All teachers will work within the framework of such legislation, as well as within LA and school policies and guidelines on curriculum and organisation. Specific variations will be made by negotiation with the Headteacher and Governing Body.
